EVSE Federal Tax Credit Reinstated and Retroactive from December 31, 2011

For American citizens and the U.S. economy, the avoidance of the "fiscal cliff" by Congress on January 1, 2013 was a big relief. Some other "end of the year" amendments were also added to the American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012 that favored electric vehicles and reinstated an Alternative Fuel Infrastructure federal tax credit for the purchase of electric vehicle supply equipment, that originally expired on December 31, 2011. **The federal tax extension has been made retroactive from December 31, 2011, so anyone that has purchased and installed EVSE during 2012 for their home use can now claim a 30% deduction up to a maximum of \$1,000 when they file their 2012 tax return.**
